Snow Clearing 101

The District of Kitimat reminds residents **NOT TO PLACE** snow from private driveways and yards on to the streets.

This practice creates:

- Hazardous driving conditions
- Impedes access for emergency vehicles
- Increases snow removal time and costs significantly

Any person depositing snow upon the roadway is subject to a \$100 ticket (see Kitimat Municipal Code 9.10.1.2)

Parking on the street is not permitted between the hours of 2:00am - 7:00am from October 1st – March 31st.

Parking is prohibited when impeding snow removal - **VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED.**
