



Notes from Council

Kitimat Council Meeting Summary of Key Items – October 7, 2019

- Council heard from the public on the Official Community Plan and Zoning Amendment application for a parking lot at 2 Dewberry. The application was denied.
- Council heard from the public on a Cannabis Retail Licensing application at 213 City Centre. Application was tabled until staff can report back on other applications.
- Council supported the Cannabis Retail Licensing application for 432 Enterprise Avenue.
- Three readings were given to the Permissive Tax Exemption Bylaw No.1957, 2019.
- A public consultation will be done for Centennial Park amenities.
- Council supported that funding be considered for the development of an invasive plant strategy, bylaws and ongoing management as part of the 2020 operational budget.
- Tendering of LED lighting upgrade for non-deck areas (change rooms, washrooms, offices, lobby, storage room and basement) of the Sam Lindsay Aquatic Centre was approved to proceed.
- Council approved that up to \$30,000 for the Canada Day Concert in 2020 be provided as part of the 2020 operational budget.
- Council approved no charge use of the Joanne Monaghan Community Room Kitchen for the purposes of sharing skills pertaining to food preparation and preservation when the kitchen is not booked.
- Council approved the Airport Transportation Subsidy Program until October 31, 2020. The program will reimburse a passenger a maximum of \$100 per trip for eligible users.
- A new campsite reservation software program will be launched in 2020. Council approved a 14 day maximum booking and that 25% of sites both electrical and non-electrical remain as non-reservable.
