



# Notes from Council

## Kitimat Council Meeting Summary of Key Items – April 6, 2021

- Following a presentation from the Mount Elizabeth Theatre, Council approved a grant for up to \$42,000 towards live streaming equipment for the Mount Elizabeth Theatre.
- Council adopted Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Bylaw No. 1994, 2021. The Bylaw supports the Phase 1 changes of the Solid Waste Management Strategy and Action Plan to provide a separate collection service for yard waste and to ban industrial waste and industrial camp waste from the Kitimat landfill site. The changes come into effect on May 1, 2021.
- Council gave first three readings to Advisory Planning Commission Bylaw No. 1993, 2021. The bylaw will be considered by Council for adoption on April 19, 2021.
- Council approved a Development Variance Permit Application at 20 Swallow Street. The variance allows for the construction of a front addition to 3.96 metres of the front property line.
- Council approved the Crossing and Encroaching Agreement with LNG Canada, which allows construction of a water line to connect the new water intake facility with the LNG Canada project site across certain portions of District highways.
- Council received for consideration a Downtown Revitalization Area Development Permit Application to construct a mixed use commercial/residential building at 676 Mountainview Square. The application will be referred to the Advisory Planning Commission, Downtown Design Panel, and Haisla Nation and Public Notice will be issued with an extended mailout to neighbouring property owners and tenants.

- Council requested staff report back on a framework to allow individual permitting of emotional support animals.
- Council requested staff investigate other possible locations for a BC Hydro funded Level 3 charging station for electronic vehicles.
- Council directed the District to issue a letter of support for a grant application by the Vulnerable Populations Committee to the UBCM's Strengthening Communities' Services Grant Program for a day time shelter. If the grant is successful, Council approved a financial commitment to the project for an additional three years beyond the initial grant funded year.
- Council approved an extension to the homeowners at 116 Whittlesey Street to comply with the conditions of the Council motion from 21 December 2020.
