



Notes from Council

Kitimat Council Meeting Summary of Key Items – April 19, 2021

- Council received a presentation from the Kitimat RCMP on the monthly policing reports for February and March 2021 as well as an overview of the joint project with the Kitimat Chamber of Commerce “Who to Call When to Call”.
- Council adopted Advisory Planning Commission Bylaw No. 1993, 2021.
- Council gave first three readings to Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Amendment Bylaw No. 1997, 2021. The bylaw amends the size of branches collected in the Yard Waste Collection Service to 12mm (1/2 inch) to be compatible with composting.
- Council gave first three readings to Housing Agreement (461 Quatsino Boulevard) Bylaw No. 1995, 2021.
- Council received for consideration a development variance permit application for 121 Liard Street to increase maximum accessory building height from 3m to 3.53m. The application will be forwarded to the Advisory Planning Commission and public notice will be issued.

- Council received for consideration Official Community Plan and Zoning Amendment applications from J. Oviatt Contracting for properties located on Loganberry. At a future meeting, Council will consider a bylaw to amend the Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw.
- Council authorized the Corporate Officer to sign off on the JGC Fluor LNG C – Kitimat, Communication Towers Public Consultation.
- Council granted a request from the Hirsch Creek Golf and Winter Club for the excess milled asphalt.
- Council directed staff to send a letter to the BC Utilities Commission in support of the City of Prince George’s March 17, 2021 letter in opposition to BC Hydro’s 2020 Street Lighting Rate Application.
