



Notes from Council

Kitimat Council Meeting Summary of Key Items – May 31, 2021

- Council received a presentation from the Be Amazing Campaign regarding the issue of human sex trafficking. Council directed staff to provide a letter of support for the campaign and denounced human sex trafficking. They will further discuss the issue during meetings with Northern health and the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General during the UBCM conference this fall.
- Following a presentation from the Kitimat Public Art Alliance (KPAA) for funding for a mural project, Council requested staff report back with a budget from KPAA to complete a mural on the City Centre Mall building.
- Following a presentation from the Tamitik Status of Women, Council approved a request for financial assistance for additional fencing costs in the amount of \$42,000 at 461 Quatsino Boulevard.
- Council approved the requirements for mobile food vendors operating on District and private land, and requested staff bring a bylaw forward for consideration amending the operating licencing fees. Council directed staff to report back on options requiring segregation of organic waste and recyclables and the use of compostable packaging and utensils by mobile food vendors.
- Council approved a bylaw be brought forward for consideration amending Leisure Services department fees, advertising rates, campground fees, and tent rental fees as well as changes to the use of the kiln and fees for youth and adult spring and summer ice rentals. Council will consider this bylaw at a future meeting.
- Council authorized the Mayor and Corporate Officer to execute the Annual Operating Agreement with BC Transit.
- Council directed staff to report back on options for elections signs as noted in their discussions.
- Council requested staff bring forward draft policy documents for the use of meeting technology, administrative corrections to Council minutes, Council correspondence and use of Notices of Motion, and delegations. These policies will be considered by Council at a future meeting.

Additional Procedures for Delegations, Terms of Reference for Committee of the Whole, Code of Conduct, and a Social Media Policy will be discussed with Council at a future meeting.
