



Notes from Council

Kitimat Council Meeting Summary – November 1, 2021

- Following a delegation from the Tamiitk Status of Women, Council resolved to support their application for a \$10,000 grant from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Canadian Women in Local Leadership (CanWILL) program. The grant will support engagement and outreach programs administered by Tamiitk Status of Women to increase women's participation in local government in Kitimat, and across northwest BC.
- Council approved the extension of the Kitimat Airport Transportation Subsidy program to October 31, 2022. The program provides subsidized travel for eligible users between Kitimat and the Northwest Regional Airport.
- Mayor Germuth was acclaimed as the Director representative to the Regional District of Kitimat-Stikine Board and Councillor Marleau was acclaimed as the Alternate Director representative.
- Council approved the Council appointments to Committees and Commissions for 2022.
- Council approved its 2022 schedule of Council meetings.
- Council requested staff to draft a bylaw for consideration increasing Council remuneration for 2022. The proposed bylaw would include an increase of \$1,632.62 per year for the Mayor, and \$905.90 per year for Councillors to account for the Consumer Price Index increase.

The Bylaw will be presented for Council consideration at a future meeting.
