



Notes from Council

Kitimat Council Meeting Summary of Key Items – January 24, 2022

- Council adopted the Housing Agreement (461 Quatsino Blvd) Bylaw No. 1995, 2021. This bylaw provides for affordable housing units, second stage housing units and transition beds in Kitimat.
- Council supported the application for the Northern Development Initiative Fund’s Community Capacity Building Grant Program to provide for a Social Development Program Coordinator and committed up to \$10,000 for program support.
- Council approved a free public swim and public skate sponsored by LNG Canada on February 21, 2022, in recognition of Family Day.
- Council provided the following comment to the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation File for a Notice of Work and Mineral Exploration:

“The District recommends conducting an expanded local stakeholder engagement process with stakeholders including, but not exclusively, local snowmobilers and hikers club, who may use the area as well as the appropriate First Nations to know about relevant traplines or other important cultural aspects of the land. Also, the applicant must check and meet the provincial regulations for conducting exploration activities in the community watershed areas as the proposal area overlaps with the watershed of Kitimat River.”

- Council approved the following grants:

Mount Elizabeth Theatre, Capital Grant	\$63,000
Kitimat Heritage Group, Community Grant	\$9,000
