

Notes from Council

Kitimat Council Meeting Summary of Key Items – June 13, 2022

- Council received a presentation from Skeena Sawmills regarding Skeena Sawmills Management Plan 8 for Tree
 Farm License No. 41. Management Plan 8 sets out the forestry operations of Skeena Sawmills for the next few
 years. Council identified a number of concerns and directed staff to report back on these concerns as part of the
 District's comment on the Management Plan.
- Council received a presentation from LNG Canada on the Sumgas Habitat Offsetting / Restoration Enhancement. Council directed staff to issue a letter of support to LNG Canada for the project and report back with an access agreement by July 15, 2022.
- Council gave third reading to Signs Amendment Bylaw No. 2017, 2022. Bylaw No. 2017, 2022 proposes changes to election signs will be brought back for Council consideration of adoption on June 20, 2022.
- Council considered the District of Kitimat Commercial Centre Revitalization Tax Exemption Program Bylaw No. 2018, 2022 and directed staff to report back on more robust incentive options for improvements to building envelopes. Bylaw No. 2018, 2022 will be brought back for Council consideration at a future meeting.
- Council gave first three readings to Election Amendment Bylaw No. 2019, 2022. Bylaw No. 2019 proposes
 amendments to the Kitimat Municipal Code with respect to elections including special voting opportunities, mail
 ballot procedures, and use of a run-off election in the event of a tie. Bylaw No. 2019, 2022 will be brought back
 for Council consideration of adoption on June 20, 2022.
- Council received a Development Variance Permit application for 56 Meldrum Street. The application is to increase the height of an accessory building from 4.9 metres to 6.1 metres. The application will be referred to the Advisory Planning Commission for comment and public notice will be issued. The Development Variance Application will be brought back for Council consideration at a future meeting.
- Council approved the list of events and use of public facility venues for Canada Day. Full details for Canada Day events can be found here.
- Council directed staff to apply to the BC Organics Infrastructure Program for a grant towards a compost facility in Kitimat and approved \$455,192 towards the project.
