Mayor Germuth and Kitimat councillors

Please receive this comment regarding LNG Canada's permit application dated January 23, 2025 for an Air Curtain Incinerator (ACI) to burn clean wood waste. This would be for a period up to 15 months:

- 1) The applicant neglected to include local air quality groups (Kitimat Airshed Group and Kitimat Terrace Clean Air Coalition) in their notification process although this is of keen interest to local air quality community groups who are within the local community where the applicant operates.

- 2) This is the third application submitted to burn clean wood waste via an ACI since 2021. Could the District of Kitimat create a sustainable wood waste disposal policy other than burning? This policy could be developed in conjunction with other stakeholders living and operating within the community prior to further additional development.
